



As a Federation of voluntary organizations, our biggest and most valuable asset has been the strong sense of unity which we have mobilised to deliver enhanced community value. Formed with this goal, FSOQ has been in the forefront of major welfare projects in times of need both in Sri Lanka or closer to home in Brisbane.

The Sri Lanka Day 2021 celebrates and showcases unique culinary tastes of Sri Lanka and our cultural heritage with those of other communities that

collectively form the multicultural diversity in Australia. Started in 2016 this is the first time we are having it as a large-scale whole day out-door event. In this event, in addition to stalls run by our member organizations we will have our own small businesses promoting their products/services. Several Sri Lankan youth organizations in Brisbane also will have their stalls. We are thankful to the Department of Multicultural Affairs in Queensland and Lord Mayor's Community Development fund for providing funding assistance to the event.



- 2. To function as an apex body representing the Sri Lankan community organisations in Queensland to further cultural, educational, social, welfare and economic interests of member organisations.
- 3. To liaise with the Government of Sri Lanka where necessary, either directly or through Sri Lanka's High Commissioner in Australia, representing the local community in Queensland.
- To engage in major welfare projects for Sri Lanka and Australia, when situation demands, with the help of our community in contributing our best to help, while engaging with the coordinators of both countries.
- Assisting distressed or disadvantaged individuals or families due to restrictions imposed by the respective governments in economic down-turns including pandemic situations.



- Assisting in rebuilding communities affected by natural disasters such as floods, drought, civil disturbances, bush fires by contributing for the reconstruction of facilities.
- 7. Support initiatives organized by approved charities to improve health facilities of under-privileged and disadvantaged communities.
- Provide leadership training for youth to engage in community projects in both Australia and Sri

Delivering greater community outcomes through a strong sense of unity

1. Premier's Queensland drought appeal (2018)

The Federation launched a community appeal and the Sri Lankan community helped raising \$3000 to look after around 200,000 farmers affected by prolonged and severe drought.

2. Premier's Queensland Flood appeal (2011)

The Sri Lankan community contributed \$20,000.00 (Twenty Thousand) to the Queensland Premier's Disaster appeal for 2010/2011 major flood relief community call. We were the highest donor as an organization as told to us by the Premier Anna Bligh at the presentation. Our community groups also got together to organize a community kitchen at Sri Lanka Buddhist Vihara, Goodna that delivered around 700 food parcels a day to affected households in Goodna and Ipswich areas.

3. Providing hospital beds to ICU and emergency wards In Sri Lanka

This has been one of our flagship projects through which we have sent around 3000 hospital beds to be used in ICU and emergency wards. These beds are sourced from public hospitals and nursing/aged care agencies. At the height of the pandemic the FSOQ with the support of the member organizations raised over \$44,000 for this project. These beds are used in

remote areas of Sri Lanka (in addition to those in Western province) that helped forming small scale ICU units in such hospitals.

4. Water purification plants to those affected by contaminated water in Sri Lanka

FSOQ was supported by the philanthropist Mr Scott Walker in installing over 112 water purification units in North and North Central provinces of Sri Lanka where most of the populations were suffering from critical kidney decease. Each unit costed US\$ 2500 most of which provide clean water to rural communities in these provinces.

5. Helping those severely affected by floods and landslides in Sri Lanka 2017

FSOQ contributed to the Sri Lankan governments flood appeal to resurrect the lives of people in flood affected regions. The Federation along with all societies were able to provide financial assistance through established charities in Sri Lanka such as Foundation of Goodness.

6. Supporting the victims of the Easter Bomb blasts in Sri Lanka in 2019

On 21 April 2019, Easter Sunday, three churches in Sri Lanka and three luxury hotels in the commercial capital, Colombo, were targeted in a



series of coordinated Islamist terrorist suicide bombings. Many lives were destroyed and the FSOQ with the Sri Lankan Community living in Queensland worked with a reputed charity in Sri Lanka foundation of goodness to assisted in medical, food and financial assistance for affected communities to recover from this dreadful situation.

7. Assisting the Sri Lankan international students affected by COVID-19 pandemic

The adversely affected Sri Lankan international students from the COVID-19 related restrictions were helped by the Federation with Help desk. The children were assisted in accommodation, negotiating accommodation rentals, and deferring university courses as the parents were not able to send the money due to closure of banks in Sri Lanka under pandemic situation. FSOQ help desk with other association officials and senior citizens were constantly in touch with these students and their parents to ensure children's safety and cared for till their parents were able to assist.

8. Raising funds to support a grieving student family after mother's death

In the height of a lockdown the FSOQ intervened in raising funds to meet funeral expenses and the future welfare of the only child of family affected by the unexpected death of the mother of the child. The community generously supported raising \$20,000.00 to the family.
